



Special Session Call for Papers:

Advances in Modelling and Statistical Research (AMSR) of the Western Balkan Countries (WBC) in the Times of Economic Crisis

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Abstract:

The special session Advances in Modelling and Statistical Research (AMSR) of the Western Balkan Countries (WBC) in the Times of Economic Crisis aims to bring together academics, practitioners, researchers, policy makers and students to share and discuss challenges and solutions in statistical methods and related quantitative disciplines, which might be applied at a broad range of areas that affect contemporary economics and society in times of crisis in selected WBC. The WB region gathers both potential and official EU candidates, leaning on the youngest EU members. This fact might be challenging in designing the models and statistical research applications reflecting empirical evidence related to sustainable development goals and growth regarding economy, business, social, industry, services, demographics, and other areas. Macro and micro views might be included, e.g. statistical modelling of production or consumption issues, hidden economy, migration from the EU candidate countries, impact of statistical methods usage to business performance, strategic impact of the ICT development indicators on selected industries, etc.)

This special session addresses not only empirical studies, but also theoretical contributions. Focus is put on statistical research methodologies and models, widely including econometric modelling, panel data analysis, multivariate analysis methods, survey research design, etc., but papers including other quantitative methods are welcome, especially if applied on the WB region's data, too. We look for high-quality original research papers that represent advances in the wider field. Prospective authors are invited to submit original papers, addressing the topics including, but not limited to:

- Theoretical analysis, statistical exploration and econometric modelling;
- Economic and other development level indicators exploration and statistical models building;
- Comparative multivariate quantitative studies for the WBC.
